

STATEMENT OF THE G-77 AND CHINA DELIVERED BY MR. INDRA ROSANDRY, PERMANENT MISSION OF INDONESIA ON BEHALF OF H.E. AMBASSADOR ALIYAR LEBBE ABDUL AZEEZ, PERMANENT REPRESENTATIVE OF SRI LANKA, AT THE OFFICIAL LAUNCHING OF THE WORLD DRUG REPORT VIENNA, 26 JUNE 2014

Excellencies, Mr. Chairman,

- 1. On behalf of the Group of 77 and China, allow me to express our great satisfaction at the official launching of the World Drug Report 2014 here in Vienna. Let me take this opportunity to convey our deep appreciation to Mr. Yuri Fedotov, Executive Director of the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime (UNODC) for his efforts leading to the realization of this event here in Vienna.
