We have achieved so much together this past year and I am proud of the new work that we have started together.

We have almost doubled our technical cooperation implementation over the last four years.

For about two thirds of our projects, you are our implementation partner mainly in Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean, Asia and the Pacific.

At this point I thank especially our main funding partners, China, Japan, EU Member States and the EU for their strong support.

I plan to expand our work together, and that includes programmatic solutions like our Programmes for Country Partnership. We increased the number of these Programmes from 15 in 2024 to 31 in 2025.

And we have also scaled up our work especially with LDCs and SIDS. These countries need especially our enhanced support.

I am committed to delivering concrete results for you on the ground.

In April we will hold the next edition of the International Vienna Energy and Climate Forum here in Vienna. The Forum will focus on the needs and priorities of LDCs, LLDCs, and SIDS.

This is another way for us to bring innovative solutions to your countries and leave no one behind in the global just energy transition.
